H. 'Pinani Island Surf' \$10 Medium

This hosta emerges in the spring with vibrant, citrus-yellow leaves edged by narrow, softly-rippled, white margins. Bright red completely saturates the petioles, flower scapes, and even pushes well into the leaf surface. Later in the summer the foliage simmers down to a light green but not until a bright spring show for winter weary eyes. If you like H. 'Fire Island,' you will love this new relative.











H. 'Dinner Mint ' \$9 Small

(M. Zillis) H. 'Dinner Mint' is a very small hosta, 7" high and 14" wide. The leaves are slightly shiny with yellow to chartreuse centers and dark green streaking margins. Purple flowers bloom on 12" reddish-purple scapes in the late summer. A very choice streaking hosta that will be noticed in any garden! A sport of H. 'Lemontini.'

H. 'Jack Berry' \$16 Medium-Large

Sturdy metallic blue-green leaves with red petioles and red veins on top. H. 'Jack Berry' comes from H. 'Halcyon' and H. 'Spritizer' and displays all the best characteristics of its classic parents. Rick Goodenough considers this one as one of his. H. 'Jack Berry' is a medium-large hosta that has lavender flowers and grows in half shade/shade. (Pod parent is H. 'Blueberry Muffin' and pollen parent is H. 'Mr. Jack'.)



H. 'Secret Treasure ' \$11 Medium

A new and distinct cultivar of hosta, the plant named H. 'Secret Treasure,' is characterized by its outwardly spreading foliage with upright flower scapes; dark shinny green and white variegated leaves; purple-colored flowers that are positioned above the foliar plane on strong scapes; and good garden performance. The foliage is of good substance and becomes nice and wavy with age. Grows quickly to 16" tall and 36" across.

H. 'Valley's Paparazzi' \$11 Medium

Pointed blue-gray leaves display large gentle waves and almost fold in places. The beautiful yellow margin changes to creamy-white, a stunning color combination, and the form of the clump is star-like. Great Substance. Jeroen's Sport of H. 'Deane's Dream.' Lavender flowers.

Each year during March, the Great Lakes Region (GLR) of the American Hosta Society hosts a garden symposium of approximately 400 enthusiastic gardeners from the Midwest and other parts of the US, Canada, and even Europe. This garden symposium is called Hosta College, and it takes place at Upper Valley Career Center in Piqua, Ohio.

Hosta College begins on Friday night with several different activities from which participants can choose. The vending area offers a large selection of plants (even though it may be snowing outside!), garden accessories, tools, and other garden-related merchandise for shoppers. FEBRUARY 7 SPEAKER: BRAD HERRICK

Jumping Worms: Everything you Might Want to Know

We are fortunate to have Brad Herrick, Ecologist/Research Program Manager of the UW-Madison Arboretum, in Madison, WI, as speaker for the February 7

meeting. Brad recently was selected as a 2018 Invader Crusader by the Wisconsin Invasive Species Council, in recognition of outstanding efforts in addressing issues of invasive species in Wisconsin. Since the Asian jumping worm was discovered at the Arboretum in 2013, Brad has spearheaded efforts to learn more about the worm. He has collaborated extensively with UW–Madison scientists and students as well as state and community partners, and "has a reputation as insightful, fun to work with, and motivated to find solutions. He's an innovative thinker and definitely a mover-and-shaker for everything from invasive plants to soil invertebrates."

Mr. Herrick will discuss the biology, behavior and ecological threats posed by these invasive worms.

Unlike the more common European nightcrawler, the Asian jumping worm (Amynthas spp.) has the ability to infest soil at high densities, change soil structure and chemistry, and damage plant roots.



Jumping earthworms survive and are distributed in mulch, and have been observed in mulched garden beds. They often are found in swarms, and as their name implies jump every direction. They have been found in downtown Minneapolis where destruction of beds with hostas and other plants have been reported, and on the outer edges of the Olmsted County Compost Site. The worms are able to turn the soil into small pellets (like coffee grounds or cat litter). There is growing concern about damage these invasive worms can do to gardens, nurseries, lawns, and native plants. Please plan to attend what will prove to be a jumpin' informative meeting! - **Chris Parisi**
