We all agree that, given the current available information about the anticipated timing of the pandemic to subside, it is likely that many of our attendees may not want to be a part of a large gathering such as our convention. We have collectively decided to postpone the 2020 MRHS Convention and reschedule it to July 8-10, 2021, at the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel in Lisle, IL. We will provide a full refund of registration fees to those already registered.

Spring Hosta Tips From an Expert

Enjoy these spring tips from Don Rawson who understands all too well how anxious we are to get things cleaned up in the garden. This is excerpted from the Western New York Hosta Society newsletter.

Tip #1: Don't be tempted to remove the winter mulch until the last frost is gone. Early arrivals, such as H. Montana 'Aureomarginata' may require additional protection from frost and wind.

Tip #2: Thoroughly clean your gardens. All debris should be raked and added to the compost bin to eliminate a breeding ground for slugs. Be careful not to rake or step on the shoots that are just popping up to avoid damaging the leaves which are about to unfold.

Are your plants in good shape?

Tip #3: Look to see if the frost has heaved your plants out of the ground- especially young hostas which were planted last year. As the ground freezes and thaws, freezes and thaws, and freezes and thaws (get the idea?), those plants may need to be tucked in on several occasions.

Tip #4: Make sure all plants, including new arrivals, are accurately labeled and the tags are in good condition. Remember that large hostas will cover up name tags that are too close to the mound. Can your friends easily read those plant labels? Or has the name tag completely disappeared?

Tip #5: Spring is the best time to prune most trees, and shrubs, after flowering. Dead branches should be cut off cleanly, chipped up, and added to the compost bin or reserved for a woodchip path.

Tip #6: Turn over your compost pile. You may want to add a little sand. The warm, rainy weather will turn all that debris into black gold. Then when those hot summer days reach 70 or 80 degrees, apply that free mulch around the base of your plants.

Tip #7: Take an inventory of your gardening supplies- tools, gloves, hoses, sprinklers, wheel- barrows, fencing, tomato cages, etc. Shop and replace worn-out items now so you have everything when you need it.

AHS Convention Is Rescheduled

The news you have been waiting for is now here. The American Hosta Society National Convention, Hosta Vision 2020, is officially postponed until 2022.



All registration fees and vendor deposits will be refunded as soon as possible in the manner in which they were paid. If you paid by check, you will receive a check. If you paid by credit card, the fee will be refunded to that card. Credit card refunds may take up to two weeks to appear on your credit card statement. T-shirts that registrants ordered will be mailed to them. You do not need to do anything to request either a refund or t-shirt. And thanks to Dennis Savory of Savory's Gardens, the convention plant, H. 'Phoenix Feathers', will be carried over for the 2022 convention.

We are grateful that the convention hotel, Minneapolis Marriott Northwest, has been very flexible in allowing us to postpone our event for two years. Many details still need to be negotiated and we will keep you posted as they become known.

The convention committee and the AHS Board of Directors know that this is disappointing. The circumstances are entirely unique and the committee and the Board felt they had no real choice in order to protect the health of the many hosta lovers who had planned to attend.

Please plan to attend the 2021 convention in Kalamazoo, MI, and then join us in Minneapolis in 2022. Enjoy your gardens this summer and stay safe and healthy.

This mail order business ships bareroot plants for a flat \$6 rate. 

H. 'Age of Gold ' (10 plants)

Forms a giant clump, 2' tall x 5' wide of large, round, corrugated leaves... looking like someone placed the sun in your woodland garden. Hosta 'Age of Gold' is sure to become an industry standard for giant gold hostas. Size: Giant

H. 'Beyond Glory' (10 plants) \$7

This sport of 'Old Glory' goes above and beyond its parent with its attractive, very wide, dark green margins. The margins measure about 3" at the widest point, more than twice the width than those of 'Old Glory'. Pale lavender flowers appear above the clump in midsummer. Size: Large

H. 'Glad Rags' (6 plants) \$10

A unique **Hosta**, **Glad Rags** lights up the shade garden with its heart shaped leaves with large brilliant yellow margins and contrasting dark green centers. In spring its leaves emerge with a chartreuse margin. The margins transform to brilliant gold, then to ivory in late summer. Size: Medium

H. 'Waterslide' (10 plants) \$7

'Waterslide' has wavy, ruffled leaves with heavy substance. The blue, rippled leaves look like water splashing in the shade garden, and hold their blue color well into the summer season. Lavender flowers appear on proportionate flower scapes in late summer. Size: Medium

H. 'Robert Frost'(10 plants) \$7

'Robert Frost' is breathtaking in spring when the frosty bluegreen leaves are bordered by a nice yellow margin. Heartshaped blue-green leaves with creamy-white margins adorn this beautiful mounding hosta. Size: Large

H. 'Blueberry Muffins' (10 plants) \$5

Medium-sized mound of blue foliage with thick leaves that are puckered and slightly rippled. The petioles are speckled with mauve which creates a nice contrast with the blue leaves. Good grower that will always look good with very nice blue color. . Size: Medium

H. 'Seducer' (10 plants) \$7

The foliage of the Shadowland Seducer Hosta is sophisticated. It has large leaves that grow in mounds. They are dark green with a gold margin with a touch of white near the center. In the summer lavender-white flowers bloom from its scape.

H. 'Sun Mouse' (10 plants) \$7

Hosta 'Sun Mouse' shows great vigor and forms a 6" tall x 18" wide clump of thick, slightly wavy, golden foliage. Each 3" long x 2" wide leaf emerges a nice gold and holds the color well. The clumps are topped with attractive heads of medium lavender flowers. Size: Mini

H. 'Diamond Lake' (10 plants) \$5 Attractive, heart-shaped, thick and heavily corrugated blue leaves have wavy margins. Large-sized clump with large leaves, they can get up to 9 inches wide by 11 inches long. Pale lavender flowers appear in early to midsummer.

Size: Large

H. 'Etched Glass' (10 plants) \$7

There are hostas, and then there's 'Etched Glass' that brings style and refinement to your hosta garden. This sport of 'Stained Glass' has wider margins and thicker leaves than the parent. Very wide, dark green margins contrast with a bright, brilliant yellow margin. Between the margin and the centers is a light green pattern. Margins have puckering when the plant is mature.

Growing Hostas from Seed – Part 2

Amidst all the negative news concerning Co-Vid 19, we thought we'd send a pleasant story your way. This comes from our president, Kathy Rustad.

In the Spring edition of the Hosta Leaf, I told you about my venture into hosta seed growing. I thought I would give you a brief update as to how my little hosta seed babies are doing so far.

Here is a picture of my little darlings on April 24th, 2020



I started out with 12 cups of seeds and am down to these 6. They are: 2 - Swoosh x Open Pollinator (OP), 2 - Gold Sport of Coalminer, 2 – Niagara Falls x OP.

Adding to my lessons learned, I should have started these little darlings in something with a plastic dome cover to help keep them moist. My alternative was to place my hosta seed babies in a plastic bag covered with a towel. This helped speed the germination process but they may have done better in a plastic dome tray. Which brings me to my second lesson learned, keep the room at a stable temperature and humidity. I struggle with this in our house. Thanks to my husband who added a room humidifier and heater, it helped but these two units were not meant to stay on 24x7. For now, this is what I have and slowly but surely these little tykes are coming along.
